MSHP Announces New Leadership Program!

MSHP today announced a new leadership program beginning in September for MSHP members. Rich Drinon's Leadership Express focuses on the four essential competencies needed by those in a leadership role. Those competencies include building relationships, achieving results, navigating change and making decisions. This 13-topic program helps experienced leaders understand the implications of both leadership and followership styles in the organization. The course examines the use of power, leverage and influence in the workplace, and important pillars of leadership such as character, commitment, competence and a maturing consciousness. Participants will explore relationship building in the framework of connecting, communicating and collaborating with others as well as approaches for getting results, promoting change, solving problems and making decisions within their respective organization.

Learning for each topic begins with an article distributed to the registrants, followed by a one hour webcast with Q&A (designed to qualify for CE). The topics are designed to lead participants through an understanding of key elements for leading others. Although each session builds upon previous entries, each session will also provide a valuable learning experience as a stand alone one hour program. The program is perfect for pharmacists, residents, pharmacy students and others interested in learning strategies for becoming a strong leader in any organization or hospital. The fee for the program is \$750 per person for the entire program, which provides a total of 13 hours of CE. The final program will take place at the MSHP Annual Meeting in April, where graduates of the program will be recognized by MSHP leaders. Most Dalfampridine-Related Seizures Occur Soon After Therapy Starts, FDA Says

The seizures that can occur during dalfampridine therapy in patients with multiple sclerosis most often happen within weeks, even days, of starting the recommended dosage, FDA said today in a drug safety communication. The "vast majority" of these seizures, the agency also said, happened in patients who had not before had a seizure. [Read more.](#)

Carfilzomib Approved for Multiple Myeloma

FDA and Onyx Pharmaceuticals today announced the approval of carfilzomib in patients with multiple myeloma. The drug will be marketed under the brand name Kyprolis. It is

indicated for the treatment of multiple myeloma in patients previously treated with at least two other therapies, including bortezomib and an immunomodulatory agent, whose disease progressed within 60 days after the last treatment. [Read More.](#)
